



## Navy Reserve Force Operational Support Summary 14 June 2013

Today, there are **63,100** Full Time Support and Selected Reserve Sailors in the Navy and **4,307** Reserve Sailors are mobilized to active duty.

### **CNAFR**

- The MPRF P-8 transition will be supported by RC via four 6-month deployments over the next six years to cover AC gaps in CCDR requirements. The first deployment cycle has begun with 70 RC aircrew/maintenance personnel and 3 aircraft deployed to C7F. This historic milestone allows RC to interoperate with AC entities in a deployment setting.
- HSL60: NAUF deployment on USS Kauffman CANX by USFF. HSL60 will host Firescout det JAN'14.
- HSC84/85 ready to support/supporting SO forces world-wide in both training and operational AORs.

### **TSW**

- During the month of May, TSW flew 312 Adversary support sorties for VFA-106 and various Fleet squadrons. Support requirements will jump substantially in the month of June to ~1100.
- VAQ-209 concluded EA-6B operations on 17 May and is fully engaged in the transition to the EA-18G.

### **CFLSW**

- VR-62 saves the lives of family adrift at sea for 7 days:

Friday May 31, 2013 - While on a NALO scheduled mission to Guam, a C-130T and its crew from VR-62 at NAS Jacksonville was tasked by Coast Guard and USPACOM leadership to assist in the search for a family of five lost at sea. Despite a lack of SAR-specific equipment and training, LCDR Todd Nichols and his crew of 7, eagerly accepted the tasking and were airborne within 12 hours of notification. Three hours into the rescue mission, AWF1 Joshua Simmons was sitting next to LCDR Nichols when he saw a flash in the distance. What Simmons saw was light reflecting off a can of Coca-Cola that the stranded family was using as a signaling device. The family had been stranded at sea for 7 days surviving on rain water. For the next 5½ hours, the crew circled the stranded family until a Japanese Merchant Marine boat could reach them for rescue. Despite getting low on fuel, the crew was able to stay on station until the Merchant boat was able to affect the recovery of the Micronesian family.

## **US FLEET FORCES COMMAND**

### **NECC**

#### **Navy Expeditionary Intelligence Command**

- A PO1 from NR NEIC 0106 was selected as a member of Naval Special Warfare (NSW) Female Support Team (FST) in Coronado, CA. She is 1 of only 5 enlisted females selected from across the nation, and the only one from the Information Dominance Community.

### **NAVCENT/C5F**

- 80 Sailors from multiple Reserve units provided support for up to 21 days to NAVCENT/5F/CMF in direct support of the International Mine Countermeasures Exercise (IMCMEX). Their superior efforts included Public Affairs planning to reach a global audience, standing up an exercise White Cell, and a variety of other watch standing and operational support initiatives.

### **CNSL**

- 73 Reservists from 30 different NOSCs, including NOSC Norfolk, NOSC Miami, NOSC Atlanta, NOSC Bessemer, NOSC Lehigh Valley, NOSC Louisville, NOSC New York, NOSC Pensacola, NOSC West Palm Beach, NOSC Jacksonville, NOSC Kansas City, NOSC Omaha, NOSC San Diego, NOSC Baltimore, NOSC Schenectady, NOSC Houston, NOSC Augusta, NOSC Charlotte, NOSC Indianapolis, NOSC West Palm Beach, NOSC Wichita, NOSC Battle Creek, NOSC Billings, NOSC Columbia, NOSC Columbus, NOSC Eugene, NOSC Minneapolis, NOSC Austin, NOSC Chattanooga, NOSC Fargo, provided 1259 man-days of pre-INSURV and other ship support to USS BATAAN (LHD-5), USS CARNEY(DDG-64), USS MESA VERDE(LPD-19), USS VELLA GULF (CG-72), USS TRUXTON (DDG-103), USS VICKSBURG (CG-69), USS WASP (LHD-1), USS GETTYSBURG (CG-64), and USS ASHLAND (LSD-48). Reservists helped with corrosion control, small arms weapon inventory, supply storeroom inventory, repair locker inventory, welding, watertight door preservation, painting, small arms' maintenance, and cleanliness. Their efforts allowed the ship's crew to focus on repairing vital equipment.

- During the month of May 2013, 1 reserve CAPT continued to provide direct support to the CNSL staff by executing oversight of the planning and execution of the CNO directed Forward Deployed Naval Force Rota Spain strategic initiative. The CNO directed the establishment of a FDNF presence in Rota Spain comprised of AEGIS Ballistic Missile Defense (BMD) ships.

## **NAVY TOTAL FORCE**

### **NAVSEA Program 29**

- RC SUPSALV EDOs and Divers provided a combined **154 man-days** in offloading USS PIONEER in San Diego. The Reservists completed block checks, pre-onload conference, engineering calculations and inspection of sea fasteners for the onload of 3 PCs prior to departure for Manama, Bahrain.

### **CPPD/NETC**

- NETC DET Pensacola completed its move to NOSC Newport and name change to NR OTC NEWPORT.

- NETC and its learning Centers will fill multiple Recruit Division Commander, Small Arms, Technical Rating, and NMT Instructor positions with RC Sailors via Definite Direct Recall Program. Senior Enlisted Instructors will support resident portion of SEA Blended Class 49.

### **BUPERS Millington/NPC**

- Eight Sailors from NR NPC Unit supported NAVPERSCOM (PERS-1) by manning the Crisis Action Organization Emergency Coordination Center (ECC) to support the Citadel Gale (Zihna) Exercise. This personnel accountability exercise affected over 450,000 Navy personnel/dependents. The Sailors directly assisted nearly 1400 personnel with mustering in Navy Family Accountability and Assessment System (NFAAS). Members generated daily status reports of NFAAS metrics to PERS-1 and participated in daily conference calls with exercise organizers. During the same time period the Sailors also supported the Oklahoma Tornado Personnel Accountability Event, which affected over 5500 Navy personnel/dependents. The Sailors contacted and accounted for over 25 Navy families scheduled to be on leave in the area at the time of the tornadoes. Members also contacted CO Representatives (COR) for accounting status for their command's personnel and assisted with the accounting effort. Daily status reports were provided to PERS-1 regarding NFAAS metrics. Lessons learned were created and forwarded to PERS-1 for future exercises and events.

### **NR DIILS**

- CDR Shapiro traveled to Tunisia, where he served as an adjunct instructor on a Mobile Education Team responsible for teaching Human Rights and Humanitarian Law to foreign soldiers. He also continued developing a Procurement Fraud Exercise for a Fall 2013 Resident Program. CAPT Noone, CAPT Verby, and LCDR Durand traveled to Yorktown, VA, to serve as faculty for a week-long Human Rights, Law of the Sea, and Law of Armed Conflict course at the International Maritime Officers' Course.

### **ONR**

- - Two (2) RC Officers provided 25 days of support to ONR by researching and developing the process to establish a Technology Forecasting cell for Expeditionary and Irregular Warfare. Reserve civilian and military expertise was critical to quickly analyzing and prioritizing existing technical capabilities and highlighting current technology gaps. **ONR Upcoming Events:**

- 8-14 July – RoboBoat, Virginia Beach, VA; 22-28 July – RoboSub, San Diego, CA: Unmanned vehicle competitions sponsored by ONR and the Association for Unmanned Vehicles Systems International (AUVSI) to promote STEM education. Student teams develop and race their unmanned vehicles in a variety of challenges. Worth a visit!

## **SPAWAR**

- One SPAWAR Reserve Network Support IT Fly Away Team provided Information Assurance (IA) training to Fleet students attached to 10 commands in the C5F AOR in Bahrain. The team provided over 1,172 student hours of Security Plus training to 35 sailors attached to: NSA Bahrain, JMAST, NIOC, NMCSO CENT, NCTS, CTF53, 55, 56, and 57. Results: The team assisted the students towards passing Security Plus certification tests which will increase Fleet IA readiness while helping these platforms to meet Cyberspace / IA workforce requirements.

- One SELRES team validated the C6F MOC C4I configurations in Naples, Italy to increase C4I system configuration management readiness. Results: The SPAWAR team provided over \$32,500 value added to SPAWAR while complying with the overarching goal of validating all MOCs over a 2-3 year period of time.

- NMCB 28 is currently in mobilization processing for training prior to deployment.
