Information Dominance Corps Reserve Command

IDCRC FY14

- Comprised of 6,560 Sailors from all 50 states
- Represents 10% of the Navy Reserve
- 20% of the Total Force uniformed Information Dominance Corps
- High Demand/Low Density RC Sailors - filling 77% of all Navy IDC Individual Augmentee assignments
- 436 Sailors currently mobilized to 10 countries and afloat, supporting over 40 Commands
- NR PACOM JIOC 0419 supported Operation Damayan efforts in the Philippines with two watchstanders placed on quick-turn orders to PACOM.
- NRSTRATCOM JEWIC furnished critical support to NATO Electronic Warfare Reprogramming efforts.
- A SPAWAR Naval Support Training team (NST) conducted training for Fleet sailors attached to NAVCOMTELSTA and other San Diego commands from 20-25 January 2014. The SPAWAR team delivered 44 hours of instruction to 42 students of 14 Commands (three afloat and 11 ashore commands) totaling 1110 student training hours. Of the 16 testing eligible students, 15 (94%) achieved CompTIA Security+ certification. The training is conducted by Reserve instructors holding the CompTIA Security+ certification and assists fleet sailors in meeting DoD Directive 8570.1 requirements to train, certify, and manage the DoD Cyberspace (CS)/Information Assurance (IA) workforce with the overall goal of increasing Fleet IA readiness. SPAWAR uses the "Best Athlete" concept to increase fleet readiness by taking advantage of Reserve Sailor's unique mix of civilian IT best practices, professional IT certifications and understanding of military C4I systems.
