Information Dominance Corps Reserve Command (IDCRC)

Operational Support Snapshot:

- 6,856 Sailors from all 50 states
- 10% of the Navy Reserve
- 20% of the uniformed Information Dominance Corps
- High Demand/Low Density Sailors - filling 74% of all Navy IDC Individual Augmentee assignments
- 405 Sailors currently mobilized to 12 countries and afloat, supporting over 40 Commands
- IDCRC is approaching the two-year anniversary of the Junior Officer Professional Development (JOPD) course. The course provides training for IDCRC JOs; expanding their understanding of IDC communities, FITREP writing, awards & award board management, security, manpower & mobilization, ranking boards and selection boards. Over 100 IDC students have completed the course, expanding and integrating the IDC's concept across multiple warfare communities.
- LT Justin Sever, software developer & member of NR ONI 0466, developed an automated review process adopted by senior ONI executives to replace a labor intensive manual review process. It provides real-time status on special projects and has an "ease of use" functionality.
- CDR Phil Notz, mobilized as CTF-51 Assistant Chief of Staff (N6) recognized an inefficiency in Battlwatch processes; they used an inefficient and ineffective method of collaboration, often resulting in a 6-hour delay in the relay of information. Working with experts in theater, they established a link directly to the shore-based ONENET from USS MAKIN ISLAND (LHD-8). Senior leaders can now view data from the fleet the moment it is posted by the ships via timely and accurate updates to the CDR's dashboard. The configuration has also undergone testing with USS IWO JIMA (LHD-7) allowing for real-time decisional quality data to be passed between ships and shore.

- NR ONI 2109 conducted an urgent-need, short-lead tasker on a high visibility DIA and ONI SPEAR assessment. The assessment required on-site linguistic support to evaluate the threat system's potential impact on friendly aircraft survivability; in direct response to real-world crisis support.
- CDR Rudolph Selitsch, assigned to NR DIAHQ 0166, coordinated the visit of 29 children from a Cambodian orphanage to the USS MUSTIN in support of USDAO Phnom Penh. The children (ages 10-14) toured the ship, ate in the galley, interacted with sailors, sat in the helicopter, rode the shore boat, and received ball caps.

IDCRC is the Reserve Information Dominance Type Commander. In this capacity, CIDCRC is responsible for professionally developing Information Dominance Reserve Sailors in the following designators/ratings:

- Meteorological & Oceanography (1805, AG)
- Information Warfare (1815, 7448, CTI, CTN, CTR, CTT)
- Information Professional (1825, 6425, 7428, IT)
- Intelligence (1835, 6455, 7455, IS)
- Space Cadre (VS5-VS8 or VR1-VR4 AQDs)
