CNAFR FY15

Mission: Maintain the Naval Air Force Reserve in a state of readiness to meet the Fleet Response Plan, conduct Overseas Contingency Operations, and support the Naval Aviation Enterprise throughout the entire spectrum from peace to war.

Fleet Impact Snapshot

- Fleet Logistics Support Wing (FLSW) aircraft and crews successfully executed the second Littoral Combat Ship “Crew Swap” mission while transporting CVW-5 personnel from Atsugi, Japan to NAS Fallon, NV. In a 12-day period, two aircraft transported all required LCS-3 and CVW-5 personnel crossing the Pacific Ocean four times and saving the Navy \$4.6M in travel and per diem expenses.
- VR-58 executed a Priority 1 mission to deliver parts for a U.S. submarine on deployment in the EUCOM AOR in less than 25 hours.
- VR-59 demonstrated innovation and flexibility by modifying an ongoing mission to Guam while airborne. The crew completed their original mission and then transported ammunition and explosives for Naval Special Warfare Unit One to Zamboanga and Puerto Princessa in the Philippines. Additionally, the crew evacuated U.S. Navy personnel from Diosdado Macpagal International Airport to Kadena AFB due to a super-typhoon.
- VR-64 transported 30k pounds of cargo (mobile dive chamber, mobile communications suite and other dive equipment) on a Priority 1 mission for Task Group 5 EOD.
- HSC-84/85 continued to provide detachments in support of CENTCOM and PACOMs Crisis Response Teams, and supported multiple exercises and engagements within both AORs.
- HM-14/15 detachments continued to provide personnel to support HM Bahrain and Korea Detachments.
- HSL-60 DET ONE, embarked USS KAUFFMAN (FFG 59), contributed to the location and seizure of a motor vessel suspected of transporting illicit cargo in the SOUTHCOM AOR. The vessel was boarded by USCG LEDET personnel who detained eight crewmembers and discovered illicit narcotics worth over \$125M.
- VFC-111 supported 14 FRS detachments for VFA-106 and VFA-122 at NAS Key West.

- HSL-60 completed their safe-to-operate inspection in the MH-60R and officially re-designated to HSM-60 on 1 JUL. They currently have three MH-60Rs and are scheduled to receive additional aircraft.
- VP-62/69 provided personnel to support active component VP deployments to the PACOM AOR. Both squadrons supported multiple CONUS and OCONUS exercises while preparing for an FY16 mobilization and deployment.
- VAQ-209 provided Airborne Electronic Attack support for the International Large Force Exercise Red Flag in Alaska.
- VFA-204, VFC-12, and VFC-13 combined to support multiple Strike Fighter Advanced Readiness Program and Air Wing Fallon detachments for CVW-2, CVW-7, CVW-3, CVW-9, and CVW-5.
