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Human Resources

The Human Resources Community (120X) is one of the Department of the Navy’s most strategic and critical assets in accomplishing the CNO’s guidance through the Manpower, Personnel, Training, and Education (MPTE) mission. It delivers HR expertise to define, recruit, develop, assign, and retain a highly-skilled workforce for the Navy Total Force. The HR Community’s strategic imperatives to *Lead, Respond, and Evolve* are firmly grounded in the CNO’s tenets of *Warfighting First, Be Ready, Operate Forward*, and are aligned with the strategic visions of the Chief of Navy Reserve (CNR) and Chief of Naval Personnel (CNP) to stabilize, balance, and distribute the force to ensure SELRES and FTS Sailors are assignable, deployable, and distributable.

The HR community leads these efforts by leveraging professional experience, expertise and education to deliver Total Force solutions; integrating technology, people, and organizational design; anticipating (and innovating) emergent and future requirements; rapidly responding to deliver tactical manpower solutions; and emphasizing continued learning, collaboration, and communication to enrich the Sailor, community and the Navy.

The Reserve HR community focuses on the same four Core Competency Areas (requirements, management, development, and recruiting) as the active component. Each aligns with the major aspects of CNP’s mission. Proficiency in HR, coupled with ongoing education and professional development, ensure Reserve HR officers possess the necessary skills to successfully lead these DoN mission areas:

- **Requirements:** Traditional manpower work with a more analytical focus; including Human Systems Integration (HSI), Financial Management (FM), & Information Technology (IT) billets include N1/J1, OPNAV N10 and N12-focused, Navy Manpower Analysis Center (NAVMAC) and N8.
- **Management:** Focuses on personnel management. Billets include OPNAV N13, NPC, CNRFC, Transient Personnel Units (TPU), Personnel Support Detachments (PSD), and NOSCS.
- **Development:** Encompasses the training and education functions of the MPTE Enterprise. Billets include training positions at U.S. Naval War College, Officer Training Command, and Naval Education and Training Command (NETC).
- **Recruiting:** Centers on the recruitment of personnel. Billets are CNRC and Military Entrance Processing Command (MEPCOM) focused.

The HR Community has evolved into the recognized leader in developing Navy and Joint Human Resource solutions. HR officers serve in key positions vital to building the 21st century Navy Total Force.
