Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command (SPAWAR)

SPAWAR develops, delivers, and sustains communications and information capabilities for warfighters, keeping them connected anytime, anywhere. The SPAWAR Reserve Program is fully integrated across the Systems Command and relies on Reserve Sailors as force multipliers to increase readiness. SPAWAR’s “Best Athlete” concept takes advantage of the Reserves’ unique mix of civilian best practices, professional certifications, and understanding of military C4I systems. In the 1st quarter of FY16, SPAWAR Reserve Sailors:

- Delivered 5,000+ training hours of CompTIA courses to 253 students from 86 different commands including Fleet concentration areas, Souda Bay, Crete and Sigonella.
- Supported Mobile User Objective System (MUOS-4) launch & On-Orbit Testing (OOT) as Launch Room Watch Officers.
- Conducted configuration validations aboard USS GRIDLEY (DDG-101), USS GRAVELY (DDG-107), USS BULKELEY (DDG-84), USS GONZALES (DDG-66), USS FORREST SHERMAN (DDG-98) and USS STOCKDALE (DDG-106) to document relevant systems interfaces for CANES and C4I systems.
- Conducted launch and recovery of MK18 Mod 2 Unmanned Undersea Vehicle (UUV) for autonomy testing and evaluation trials.
- Supported a “Breaking the Surface “Unmanned Vehicles event in Biograd, Croatia.
- Currently providing underway systems support to CENTRIXS coalition communications aboard a Chilean navy ship participating in UNITAS PACIFIC.
- Embarked on the EISENHOWER Carrier Strike Group (CSG) to coordinate NAVIDFOR/SPAWAR team activities & assist troubleshooting of CSG/ESG/ARG systems interoperability.
- Provided Host-Based Security System (HBSS) and other Cyber-Security Engagement Team (CSET) support to afloat units in Bremerton, WA, to enhance deployment readiness.
- Provided Piers Network Architecture support for Naval and Commercial piers serviced by NCTAMS for evaluation and documentation of current specifications & configurations of pier network gear and physical confines.
- Provided operational support to Navy Reconnaissance Office (NRO) and USPACOM at Camp Smith, HI, AFRICOM Stuttgart, Germany, and USFK in Seoul, Korea.
