### Reserve Naval Special Warfare (SPECWAR)

**Naval Special Warfare Group 11** (NSWG-11) is the headquarters for which SEAL Team SEVENTEEN (ST-17) and SEAL Team EIGHTEEN (ST-18) directly report. NSWG-11 tasks ST-17 and ST-18 with providing a strategic Reserve with operational capabilities in support of special operations worldwide. NSWG-11 is currently providing over 100 highly trained and experienced SEAL, Special Warfare Combatant Crewman (SWCC), and Combat Service Support (CSS) Sailors deployed in support of special operations missions across the globe.

**SEAL Task Elements:** 20 NSWG-11 SEAL and CSS Sailors are actively engaged in direct support to Theater Special Operations Commands (TSOCs) providing Foreign Internal Defense, Joint Combined Exercise Training (JCET), Key Leader Engagement, and exercise support in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR). ST-17's task element continues to provide critical support to Special Operations Command Korea (SOCKOR) while building partner nation capability and capacity.

**SWCC Detachment:** Six ST-18 SWCC Sailors continue to serve as the operational maneuver element for Combined Task Force 71 and NSWU-1 while providing JCET and exercise support to Special Operations Command Pacific (SOCPAC) requirements resulting in heightened theater security readiness and increased partner capability/capacity.

**Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS):** UAS Detachment Alpha is currently deployed as the first NSWG-11 UAS Det supporting NSWU-10 directed missions. NSWG-11 UAS leadership is actively driving the ongoing recruitment of aircraft vehicle operators and cryptologic technicians.

**Combat Service Support (CSS):** 48 CSS Sailors are supporting critical missions within the Special Operations Command Central (SOCCENT) and Special Operations Command Africa (SOCAF) AOR. CSS personnel supporting the Special Operations Command Central (SOCCENT) Crisis Response Element are having direct and significant impacts on high visibility operations while providing reporting on key developments.

**Individual Augmentees:** Five NSWG-11 SEAL Sailors continue to serve in critical leadership and LNO roles supporting operational SOCCENT and SOCAF missions that have resulted in enhanced mission completion and optimal utilization of NSW forces in the Joint and combined environments.
