INFORMATION DOMINANCE CORPS RESERVE COMMAND (IDCRC)

Overview:

- Aligning with CNO’s “Design for Maintaining Maritime Superiority”- Information Dominance Corps is preparing to become “Information Warfare Community” (IWC):
 - Information Dominance Corps Reserve Command (IDCRC) is expected to be renamed: Naval Information Force Reserve (NAVIFORES)
 - Naval Information Dominance Forces (NAVIDFOR) to be renamed: Naval Information Forces (NAVIFOR)
- IDCRC is composed of 7,300 Reserve Sailors from all 50 states
- 13% of the Navy Reserve
- 23% of the uniformed Information Warfare Community
- High Demand/Low Density Sailors - filling over 73% of all Navy IWC Individual Augmentee assignments
- 416 Sailors currently mobilized to 12 countries & afloat, supporting over 40 Commands

Operational Snapshot:

- NR JICCENT 0274:** Unit analysts identified the location of an ISIL flag in non-ISIL territory; re-shaped the ISIL force location graphic & led to the nomination of new ISIL targets.
- NR AFRICOM J2 0166:** Lt. Cmdr. Morton traveled to Uganda and was the first Reservist to support the Military Intelligence Training Program (MITP) Associate Instructors (AI) program. The MITP trains African partners to collect, analyze, produce & use intelligence to shape operations; crucial to countering terrorists transiting porous borders.
- SPAWAR 0466:** Provided 24/7 coverage as Launch Room Watch Officer of the MUOS-3 launch at the Naval Space Operations Center.
- NR STRATCOM JFCC Space:** Participated in a high visibility investigation into anomalies on POTUS nuclear satellite communications (SATCOM). Team produced an exceptional final report lauded by flag officers, with tangible & impactful process changes for our nation’s most important strategic capabilities, representing \$2B plus in space assets.
- NR NMORA USNO 0292:** Meteorological and Oceanographic (METOC) unit established in support of U.S. Naval Observatory; providing physical battlespace awareness to Navy and Joint warfighters.

- NR NSW INTEL 17:** OCONUS deployed members directly support multiple high profile SEAL Team missions in high threat areas.
- NR CNO INTEL:** Lt. Crum identified a significant national security issue related to an international information-sharing agreement. His insightful analysis & intelligence report had immediate & positive impact at the national level.
- USFF MIOC:** Cmdr. Costales developed a USFF OPSEC program on long term ADT orders. During a recent USFF IG Inspection, the program received excellent marks; regarded as model program for the Navy. Unit working closely with OPNAV to capture & relay lessons learned.
