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Bureau of Medicine and Surgery (BUMED)

BUMED FY16:

- Navy Reserve Medicine (NRM) represents a highly diversified community of medical professionals spread across virtually the entire Navy Reserve Force.
- Comprised of 2,338 Navy Medical Staff Corps Officers and over 4,232 Navy Hospital Corps SELRES.
- Total of 6,570 Sailors from all 50 states
- Approximately 13% of the Navy Reserve Force
- 12% of Navy Medicine's Uniformed Force
- The majority of NR Medicine Sailors are assigned to either BUMED or MARFORRES units; 70% and 20% respectively.
- There are 50 RC Sailors currently mobilized in support of contingency operations worldwide, primarily to GTMO and the Horn of Africa. An additional 97 have orders in-hand.

Operational Support Snapshot:

4th Medical Battalion

- Integrated Training Exercise (ITX): The largest Marine Corps Reserve exercise of the year takes place at Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center in 29 Palms, California. It allows Marine Reserve units from across the U.S. to practice increasingly complex tactics, techniques and procedures leading up to a scenario-driven final exercise.
- African Lion (AL): An annual joint force exercise that involves more than 3,000 U.S. and partner-nation troops. As the largest exercise on the continent, 2016 will focus on reinforcing training engagements from previous AL exercises, creating a foundation for future military-to-military cooperation.
- Marine Forces Reserve (MFR) medical officers and corpsmen are currently deployed in support of Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force – Crisis Response Central Command (SPMAGTF-CR-CC), Kuwait.
- MFR medical/dental personnel at Deployment Processing Command (DPC) provide medical and dental screening and support to 300 Marines headed to Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force-South (SP-MAGTF-South). There they will prepare to form the U.S. military's first rapid-response task force to be based in Central America, where they will train with local forces battling drug cartels and stand ready to help in the event of hurricanes & other natural disasters.

NR Planning Support for Pacific Partnership: MAY-SEP16

USNS Mercy will spend approximately 6 months underway providing humanitarian assistance throughout the PACOM AOR. BUMED SELRES will fill 18 Pacific Partnership requirements while on board with hundreds of AC medical personnel from Navy Medical Center San Diego (NMCS). Reserve doctors, nurses, hospital corpsmen and other health professionals will provide support onboard USNS Mercy and other MTFs across the US.

NR EMF Camp Pendleton Field Medicine Training: 7-8NOV15

Ninety four members of NR Expeditionary Medical Facility Camp Pendleton (comprised of 61 enlisted and 33 officers) attended an intensive two-day training evolution at the Army's Camp Parks' medical simulation training center outside of Dublin, CA. Medical Reserve Sailors from 3 local detachments trained on the setup and take down of tents and the construction of a field hospital that would be used in theater. They also received hands-on and classroom medical training, with a focus on hemorrhage control and tactical care and an opportunity to practice Tactical Combat Casualty Care skills in a simulated tactical setting, using moulage, manikins and tactical gear.
