Legal

Judge Advocate General Corps FY16

Mission: The Navy Judge Advocate General's Corps provides solutions, from a military perspective, to legal issues involving military operations, organization, and personnel. They do this wherever and whenever such solutions are required, with primary focus on operations, accountability, Sailor legal readiness, and Navy legal readiness.

- There are 402 Judge Advocates and 150 Legalmen within the Navy Reserve.
- Since FY09, there have been approximately 451 officer mobilizations for contingency operations in Afghanistan, Horn of Africa, Guantanamo Bay, Kuwait and within the U.S.
- **Reserve Law Program**
 - There are approximately 23 Reserve Sailors on ADSW orders (20 officers /3 enlisted) with an additional 27 officers currently on definite recall.
 - Reserve Sailors assigned as military judges have presided over 17 court-martials worldwide to date in FY16. Those assigned as Appellate Court judges have reviewed 82 (52% of the pending) court-martials records of trial in FY16.
- **NR Fifth Fleet Legal Unit** Drilling from NOSC Tampa, this new unit supports Commander U.S. Navy Fifth Fleet, Naval Forces Central Command, and their Fleet Judge Advocate in Bahrain, in conducting maritime operations to forward U.S. interests, to deter and counter disruptive countries, defeat violent extremism and strengthen partner nations' maritime capabilities in order to promote a secure maritime environment in the CENTCOM area of responsibility.
- **NR Preliminary Hearing Unit** This new unit provides officers to the Fleet for hearings under Article 32 of the UCMJ. Hearing officers take evidence, witness testimony and make recommendations to convening authorities for whether or not a case should be sent to a court-martial or other disciplinary forum. Unless waived, an Article 32 hearing is required for any case referred to a General Court-Martial.

- **NR RLSO NW** received the 2016 Rear Adm. Hugh H. Howell Jr. Award for Excellence for Best Unit, West Coast. NR RLSO NW directly supports Region Legal Service Office Northwest in providing prosecution, command services, and legal assistance services to Navy and Marine Corps commands within the states of Washington, Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Wyoming.
- **NR NJS** received the Rear Adm. Hugh H. Howell Jr. Award for Best Unit, East Coast. NR NJS supports the Naval Justice School in its mission to train all Sea Service judge advocates, and enlisted and civilian legal professionals to deliver quality legal services, promote justice, and enhance fleet readiness, and to train leaders and legal support personnel to perform their command and staff duties in accordance with U.S. and international laws.

- 6 Military Justice units
