Submarine Force Reserve Component (SFRC)

Mission: Submarine Force Reserve Component (SFRC) efficiently provide capable Sailors who seamlessly integrate into active commands worldwide to enhance effectiveness and accomplish Submarine Force missions.



Vision: To be known for providing exceptional mission support to the Submarine Force . To be in demand for our undersea warfare knowledge and experience. To be seen as a valuable part of the Submarine Force team.



Lines of Effort (LoE): SFRC operates along five LoEs:

Undersea Warfare Operations (UWO): Provides Sailors who conduct undersea warfare and planning at the operational level of war. UWO Sailors stand watch at five CTFs (as shown above), serve aboard the diesel submarines of partner navies as liaison officers, conduct Submarine Culture Workshops onboard submarines and work with unmanned undersea vehicles (UUVs).



Expeditionary Maintenance (EM): Sailors conduct repair and maintenance in tender repair shops and on submarines to ensure they are ready for sea. At Reserve Intermediate Maintenance Activities (RIMA), as shown above, EM Sailors fabricate parts for submarines from raw materials.

Submarine Rescue (SUBR): SFRC Sailors make up half the manning for the only permanent U.S. Navy submarine rescue command. SUBR Sailors are on standby 24/7 and are an essential part of an AC/RC team.



Force Protection (FP): Sailors provide security for submarines in port. Weapons qualified FP Sailors stand perimeter watches and control access to ballistic missile submarines (SSBN) when away from home port. Most FP Sailors come from security related rates.

Undersea Warfare Development Center (UWDC): UWDC Sailors teach Anti-Submarine skills to the active component and certify ASW watch teams. Recently SFRC supported the surfacing of a U.S. Submarine under the polar ice cap.
