## Navy Expeditionary Combat Command (NECC)

### NECC FY14

Navy Expeditionary Combat Command (NECC) serves as the single functional command for the Navy's expeditionary forces and as central management for the readiness, resources, manning, training and equipping of those forces. Expeditionary forces are organized to accomplish specific objectives in other countries.

NECC is a scalable force spanning the full range of military operations from theater security to major combat. Made up of dedicated, ready Sailors, NECC forces are high impact, operating around the globe, building partnerships, and helping increase partner navies' capability to promote peace and prevent war. However, when called upon, they also become primary enablers for a combat commander to win a crisis or war effort.

NECC is a force provider for integrated maritime expeditionary missions. The subordinate units are a core expeditionary force providing "smart power," applying just the right power, at the right time, at the right place. This may cover a variety of missions such as: effective waterborne and ashore anti-terrorism, force protection, theater security cooperation and engagement, humanitarian assistance/disaster relief contingencies, and supplementing other Governmental agencies for homeland security upon request.

NECC forces seamlessly blend active and Reserve components with Reserve units training and deploying like their active duty counterparts. Using operational Reserve forces, the Reserve Component is fully capable of providing the same capability and capacity as their active duty counterparts.

#### Fleet Impact Snapshot:

- 49 Reserve Sailors from Navy Expeditionary Logistics Regiment (NELR) FIVE, Navy Cargo Handling Battalion (NCHB) FIVE, and NCHB FOURTEEN provided expeditionary air and surface cargo logistics support, as well as communications support for RIMPAC 2014 at Fleet Logistics Center Pearl Harbor, HI.
- 28 Reserve Sailors from NCHB TEN conducted surface cargo training operations ISO Operation Pacer Goose in Norfolk, VA.
- 18 Reserve Sailors from NCHB EIGHT conducted air cargo training operations ISO Patriot Partner in Norfolk, VA.
- 513 Reserve Sailors from NELR FOUR, NCHB ELEVEN, and NCHB THIRTEEN completed their Unit Level Training Readiness Assessment (ULTRA), certifying as Ready for Mobilization (RFM).
- 26 Reserve Sailors from NCHB FIVE conducted fueling operations during Operation Vapor Lock onboard Ft. Irwin, CA.
