



Navy Reserve Total Force Support of Recent Critical Overseas Missions

Odyssey Dawn

March 24, 2011

Thirty-two officer and 11 enlisted Navy Reserve personnel are serving in key positions in Joint Task Force (JTF) *Odyssey Dawn* onboard the USS *Mount Whitney* (LCC 20) underway in the Mediterranean and in Naples, Italy with the Commander 6th Fleet staff. These personnel, who hail from both 6th Fleet and other reserve units, volunteered for duty as part of the Navy Total Force, arriving on station and within 72 hours of request for support notification. RC Sailors are serving in positions ranging from logistics, operations, to Joint Operations Center Yeoman. *Odyssey Dawn* encompasses all U.S. AFRICOM-led planning in support of the broader U.S. Government response to the Libyan government's violent response to civil uprisings.

Operation Tomodachi

Five Navy Reserve fleet logistics support aircraft are on station (two C-40As, two C-130Ts and one C-9B)

Fleet Logistics Support Squadron 62 (VR-62) responded to a short notice *Priority 1* tasking from 7th Fleet/Commander Fleet Air Forward to redirect a C-130 Hercules from a NALO mission in Guam to Japan. With minimal operational support, the composite Selected Reserve/FTS crew redirected to Atsugi transporting 10,375 lbs of radiological control equipment and 18 members of the Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam Radiological Control Team (RCT) 105.3 to assist in humanitarian relief efforts.

March 20 –Transported medical equipment and generator for use in relief efforts

March 21– Transported power generators, 17 passengers and 21,900 lbs of supplies from Atsugi to Misawa

March 22 –Transported 31,560 lbs of food

March 23 – Moved Explosive Ordnance Disposal Unit 5, Detachment 51, to Misawa to assist with clearing and opening ports

VR-58 received a *Priority 1* airlift to transport a Radiological Control Team from Norfolk, Va., to Japan. The crew launched within six hours after notification and will remain in Japan as a surge detachment.

Akron-based Navy Reserve U.S. Forces Japan Detachment 105 has 27 members providing support to USFJ headquarters at Yokota Air Base. The unit had members in Japan prior to the earthquake while others surged immediately following the quake and resulting tsunami.
