



A Day in the Navy Reserve March 22, 2013

Today, there are **63,702** Full Time Support and Selected Reserve Sailors in the Navy and **4,070** Reserve Sailors are mobilized providing overseas contingency operation support.

CNO Operations and Plans

1. Cmdr. David Campbell, a member of NR CNO Operations and Plans, provides support to the Active Duty Oceans Law and Policy Advisor to the DCNO, N3/N5. This office is responsible for giving advice on a wide variety of legal and policy matters including International and Operational Law, Ethics, Oceans Law and Policy and Fiscal Law. Cmdr. Campbell's civilian experience at a Defense Office of General Counsel also provides a unique skill set in the areas of Contract law and Civilian Personnel matters.

Commander, U.S. Navy Reserve Forces Command

1. Navy Operational Support Center Norfolk is mobilizing seven Sailors to support operations around the globe. Cmdr. Paul Phelan, CS1 Salina Miller, and IT1 Mary Kindle are mobilizing to units in Afghanistan; Cmdr. Anthony Caramando and IS2 Alan Doerter are mobilizing to Djibouti; ABH3 Jediah Mountz is mobilizing to Bahrain; and YN1 James Demery is mobilizing to U.S. Central Command.

Commander, U.S. Fleet Forces Command

1. Sixteen Reserve Sailors from Commander, Strike Force Training Atlantic Force Protection (CSFTL FP) complete Security Reaction Force Training at Naval Station Norfolk. CSFTL certifies all U.S. Fleet Forces ships in force protection prior to overseas deployments.

2. Cmdr. Dean Wackeman is providing operational support to Tactical Training Group Atlantic (TTGL) with his active duty counterpart, Cmdr. David Sherriff of the Royal Navy. Cmdr. Sherriff is currently serving with TTGL as the Coalition Officer in Charge (OIC), bridging the gap between the U.S. Navy and our coalition partners during Fleet Synthetic Training (FST) Events.

3. Lt. Cmdr.(s) Marin Jakawich is providing operational support for Tactical Training Group Atlantic (TTGL), on board USS Monterey (CG 61) during Ballistic Missile Defense Exercise (BMDEX) 13-06. The BMDEX program is designed to train and certify Ballistic Missile Defense ships prior to deployment. Along with her active duty counterparts, Lt. Cmdr.(s) Jakawich is providing mentoring and evaluation support for the exercise among three geographically-dispersed ships: USS Monterey (CG 61), USS Benfold (DDG 65) and USS Lake Erie (CG 70).

Commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet/U.S. 3rd Fleet/U.S. 7th Fleet

1. A total of 31 Reserve Sailors from four different Commander, 7th Fleet Reserve units are underway aboard USS Blue Ridge (LCC 19), along with 67 other Reserve personnel serving in nine different locations in Korea and Japan, in support of Exercise Key Resolve 2013. The purpose of Exercise Key Resolve is to improve the theater operation performance capabilities of

the U.S. and Republic of Korea's combined defense forces, while emphasizing a combined commitment towards a long-term friendship and continuous alliance between our two countries.

2. NR Commander U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) Maritime Operations Center (MOC) DET 301 Reservist, Cmdr. Tim Holyk provides support to COMPACFLT Current Operations Sensitive Reconnaissance Operations (SRO) including the scheduling and execution of SRO missions throughout the U.S. Pacific Command (USPACOM) area of responsibility in coordination with USPACOM Joint Reconnaissance Center, Commander, 7th Fleet, and Commander, Task Force 72; and development of the new COMPACFLT Operation Order 201 SRO Appendix.

3. NR Commander U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) Maritime Operations Center (MOC) DET 301 Reservist, Lt. Stephanie Barth provides support to COMPACFLT Current Operations Expeditionary and Surface Action Desks. She coordinates diplomatic clearances from the task force level up to the Chief of Naval Operations in support of COMPACFLT vessels entering foreign ports. In coordination with USPACOM Joint Operations Center Maritime personnel (JOC NAV) she supports the coordination of several Freedom of Navigation (FON) exercises by various COMPACFLT surface assets in the USPACOM AOR.

4. A NR HQ Commander, Naval Forces Korea (CNFK) Reservist provides support as a member of the Naval Operational Coordination Team (NOCT) which supports CNFK during exercise Key Resolve. As the NOCT Public Affairs Officer, he interfaces with the Republic of Korea (ROK) Navy to create joint media products that improve ROK/US interoperability and the combat readiness of both forces. His efforts support increased strategic, operational and tactical readiness for the Combined Force engaged in the maintenance of stability in the Korean Theater of Operations.

5. Three Reservists from NR Commander U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) Maritime Operations Center (MOC) DET 301 participate along with their active staff counterparts from the COMPACFLT MOC in a Naval War College Staff Assist Visit to support COMPACFLT's MOC transition to operations as a theater-level Joint Force Maritime Component Commander in support of higher headquarters guidance. Senior leadership and staff further refine processes, tools and manpower models to support planning and execution of COMPACFLT mission sets, and the lateral coordination required across component commanders supporting U.S. Pacific Command.

6. A Reserve sailor from Commander U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) DET 419 (Camp Parks, CA) serves as the qualified Maritime Intelligence Operations Center-Pacific (MIOC-P) Watch Captain (MWC) at the COMPACFLT Headquarters. As the MWC, he is responsible for supervising a six-man, 24/7 watch team which provides real-time Indications and Warnings to the COMPACFLT and to forward-deployed Naval forces.

7. Three Reservists from Commander U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) DET 194 (San Diego, CA) continue their under-instruction intelligence watch standing training during the Maritime

Domain Situational Awareness (MDA) training. This ongoing training increases the Maritime Intelligence Operations Center-Pacific (MIOC-P) watch standing capability.

8. Three Commanders from the NR Commander U.S. Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) DET 120 Logistics Readiness Center (LRC) HQ unit are on annual training orders in support of the COMPACFLT N4 staff. These individuals are providing valuable insight as COMPACFLT reorganizes active and reserve members to support the new role as a theater-level Joint Force Maritime Component Commander (JFMCC) N4 and J4 in future U.S. Pacific Command and COMPACFLT exercises.

9. Four enlisted sailors of the NR Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach (NWSSB) DET Fallbrook Explosive Offload Teams (EOT) ONE and TWO are providing support for Vertical Replenishment (VERTREP) operations in support of NWSSB. The operation included moving more than 700 pallets of ammunition to and from storage areas on base and to vessels on berth and took place over a four-day period.

10. Three members of the NR Naval Magazine Indian Island (NAVMAGII) DET A are assisting in Receipt, Segregation, Stowage, and Issue (RSSI) of various classes of ammunition. The Reserve support to NAVMAG II is critical in helping them keep pace with their workload while dealing with a reduced civilian workforce since last year.

11. Commander, 3rd Fleet Maritime Air Operation Det Las Vegas are wrapping up participation in the high-intensity air-to-air combat exercise Red Flag 13-3 at Nellis AFB, Nev. Unit members, recognized as operational level of war (OLW) subject matter experts are being led by, Cmdr. David "Boats" Bowen. He serves as the Navy and Amphibious Liaison Element (NALE) and AEGIS/BMD Navy Liaison Officer to the integrated air and missile defense (IAMD) effort. Their participation marks the largest Navy Reserve footprint at the exercise on record and provides valuable joint, OLW, and cross-component training by interacting with USAF's 603rd Air and Space Operations Center, based in Ramstein, Germany.

Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command/ U.S. 4th Fleet

1. One Sailor from Navy Reserve, Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command, Commander, 4th Fleet (NR USNAVSO/C4F) Mayport, Fla., produces a Navy News Service Story titled, "Navy Airship Visits 4th Fleet, Naval Station Mayport", and covers the Decommissioning Ceremony of the USS Klakring (FFG 42) at Naval Station Mayport. Eleven Sailors (Masters-at-Arms) from various Reserve Units stand various Force Protection Security Watches in support of Patrol Squadron 10 (VP-10) deployed to Cooperative Security Location Comalapa, El Salvador. Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Southern Command, Commander, 4th Fleet operates the location, which is located at the Comalapa International Airport, and is part of a long-term agreement between the United States and El Salvador. Some of the 11 Sailors conduct joint security patrols with Salvadoran Air Force personnel.

Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Europe/Africa/ U.S. 6th Fleet

1. One Officer from Commander, Naval Forces Europe/Africa, Commander 6th Fleet (CNE-CNA-C6F) Intel Detachment 0167 from Atlanta, Georgia, serves at CNE-CNA-C6F Headquarters in Naples, Italy, as the Foreign Disclosure Officer. She reviews requests from staff members and subordinate commands to ensure that any disclosure of U.S. controlled unclassified and classified military information to foreign governments and international organizations is conducted in accordance with national disclosure policy and other applicable regulations.
2. Two officers from Maritime Partnership Program (MPP) Det 130 in Naples, Italy and Det 118 in Aurora, CO, work on Job Qualification Requirements (JQR) for Battle Watch Captain (BWC) and Assistant Battle Watch Captain (ABWC) in the Commander, Naval Forces Europe/Africa, Commander, 6th Fleet (CNE-CNA-C6F) Maritime Operations Center (MOC). The BWC and ABWC watch positions lead the 24/7 current operations watch team, and are the direct representatives of CNE-CNA and C6F/CTF6 for current operations throughout the U.S. Naval Forces Europe and U.S. Naval Forces Africa areas of responsibility.
3. One Officer from Commander, Naval Forces Europe/Africa, Commander, 6th Fleet Intel Detachment 0167 from Atlanta, Georgia serves as the Combined Intelligence Fusion Cell (CIFIC) Watch OIC in charge of one of three teams that manages the data collection for a continuous mission supporting Operation Nomad Shadow in Ankara, Turkey. Each day the CIFIC controls US Government assets in order to gather information necessary for a wide range of mission support.

Commander, Navy Expeditionary Combat Command
