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RMKS/1. This is a solicitation for

Full Time Support (FTS) and/or Selected Reserve (SELRES) nominees in the paygrades E-7 to E-9 and O-3 to O-6 to fill board member vacancies on the NNRPB and NRPB for a 3 year commitment starting in January 2016. Applicants must have a minimum of 3 years of eligible service remaining.

2. Per reference (a), Commander, Navy Reserve Force (COMNAVRESFOR) convenes the NRPB, which is the single point of entry for all policy recommendations from Navy Reserve Sailors. The NRPB reviews all Chief of Navy Reserve and COMNAVRESFOR policy change recommendations, and if approved, submits them for final review and disposition. Policy change recommendations which require Navy-wide approval, Department of Defense approval or legislative changes are forwarded via COMNAVRESFOR to the Secretary of the Navy (SECNAV) NNRPB. The COMNAVRESFOR NRPB works year round via email, video teleconference (VTC), and teleconference. Additionally, board members are required to travel to Norfolk, VA two to three times per year for board meetings. The board chair shall personally notify those selected.

3. Per reference (b), the SECNAV convenes the NNRPB to consider, recommend and report any and all matters of policy affecting the Navy Reserve. Issues include but are not limited to: readiness, manpower/personnel, resourcing, training, equipping, funding,

warfighting, family support and quality of life. Board members will dedicate considerable time to policy issues throughout the year via electronic means and must be able to attend a maximum of two NNRPB meetings per year. Committees work year round via email, VTC, and teleconference. In addition, board members are regularly contacted to provide opinions on Navy Reserve matters to the Deputy Assistant SECNAV for Reserve Affairs and may also be required to travel to provide onsite interface with Reserve Component personnel in order to facilitate policy board process awareness. The President of the NNRPB shall personally notify those selected.

4. Starting on 01 May 2015, applicants may submit packages for consideration. Applicant packages shall:

b. For officers, include the member's last five Fitness Reports, Officer Summary Record, and Performance Summary Record (PDF format), Navy biography, Official Navy photo in khakis, personal statement on "Why I want to be a board member" and their endorsement from Immediate Superior In Command (ISIC) for the board or boards applying.

c. For Enlisted Personnel the member's last five evaluations, Personnel Data Summary and Performance Summary Record in PDF format, Navy biography, Official Navy photo in khakis, personal statement on "Why I want to be a member" and their endorsement from their ISIC for the board or boards for which they are applying.

5. Selectees will be notified no later than 30 September 2015. Nominees who have requested consideration for both boards will be considered for the NNRPB first.

6. Policy board application packages are exempt from reports control per reference (c).
