- X=0 An active duty officer
- X=5 An officer of the Naval Reserve (NOTE: Exceptions are designators with a 4th digit of 7, 8 or 9)
- X=7 An officer of the Naval Reserve on active duty in the Full Time Support (FTS) Program, previously known as the Training and Administration of the Reserve (TAR) Program; includes officers of the FTS Program rotated to other than FTS billets
