## **Advancement Exam Eligibility**

Promotions to the rates of Petty Officer Third Class (E-4) through Chief Petty Officer (E-7) require an advancement exam. Understanding the requirements for advancement before you sit down and take an exam is imperative for your success. Reserve Sailors typically test in February and August of each year if the following criteria are met:

- Commanding Officer or Officer in Charge recommendation is the most important advancement eligibility requirement, and the sole source for that recommendation is your most recent evaluation report in block 45. "Promotable," "Must Promote" and "Early Promote" are all recommendations for advancement.
- Meet the minimum Time in Rate (TIR) requirement for promotion to the next paygrade. Your TIR date is located in your Electronic Service Record (ESR). The Terminal Eligibility Date (TED) used to compute TIR is published in the advancement NAVADMIN. For example, the TED for the February 2021 exam is 1 July 2021 for E-4 though E-6 and 1 January 2022 for E-7 candidates. A Petty Officer Third Class must have a TIR date of 1 July 2020 or earlier to be eligible for the E-5 advancement examination. See infographic
- Complete and pass PMK-EE (80%) for the paygrade testing.
- Meet special requirements such as: security clearance, medical, citizenship, and ASVAB as required by rating

PAYGRADE	TIR
E-1 to E-2	9 months
E-2 to E-3	9 months
E-3 to E-4	6 months
E-4 to E-5	12 months
E-5 to E-6	36 months*
E-6 to E-7	36 months*
E-7 to E-8	36 months
E-8 to E-9	36 months

- Successfully complete a service school, if required
- \*COs/OICs may waive up to 1 year of the required TIR for Sailors in paygrades E5 and E6 who received a promotion recommendation of "Early Promote" on their most recent observed periodic evaluation in their current paygrade.
