HELP UNTANGLE THIS MISUSED NAVY RESERVE TERM

A "GOOD YEAR" REFERS ONLY TO YEARS NEEDED FOR PAID RETIREMENT

A "Good Year" is a qualifying year of service toward retirement

After 20 "Good Years" of service you qualify for a paid retirement from the Navy Reserve

Based on your unique **Anniversary Date*** when you affiliated with the Navy Reserve

A minimum of 50 points in the 12 months from your Anniversary Date equals a "Good Year"

Obtaining less than 50 points does not count for a qualifying year for retirement

SATISFACTORY PARTICIPATION

IS YOUR MANDATORY SERVICE REQUIREMENT

Every Reserve Sailor has a mandatory obligation for satisfactory participation

The mandatory requirement is based on the traditional "one weekend a month, two weeks a year"

Based on a **Fiscal Year**, Oct. 1 to Sept. 30, which is the same for everyone

A minimum of 40 drill periods plus at least 12 days active duty in a fiscal year. (AT/ADT/ADSW/MOBILIZATION)

Mandatory - Without authorized absences and AT waivers a Sailor risks ADSEP*
