Status of the Navy Reserve at start of FY10

- The Navy Reserve is a Force in demand.
- Because of your efforts, our Sailors and their skills are sought by the Navy and Marine Corps team and Joint Forces worldwide.
- Today, more than 6,400 Reserve Component Sailors are mobilized to active duty.
- We provide valued capabilities and we are a cost-effective Force.

The importance of being cost-effective

- Our Nation faces difficult financial choices.
- Being a cost-effective Force is vital to our national security and the continued relevance of the Navy Reserve.
- America will invest resources in our Navy Reserve only if the Nation perceives that we are ready, accessible and cost-effective.

How to be a cost effective Force

- Not just doing more with less.
- Do things right and do the right things.

Example: Mobilization Readiness

- Identified as a major issue as part of the FY09 Initiatives in *Ready Now: The Navy Reserve Strategic Plan*.
- One issue that impacts every Reserve Sailor.
- Post 9/11, tens of thousands of Sailors mobilized.
- Multiple mobilization checklists emerged from "tribal knowledge" "good ideas" or outdated info.
 - Result 1: Mobilization failures due to unclear standards.
 - Result 2: Wasted effort training for invalid requirements.
- Both waste money and frustrate Sailors.

Solution: One common checklist for ALL Navy

- MILPERSMAN 1300-318, SCREENING PROCEDURES FOR GLOBAL SUPPORT ASSIGNMENT (GSA), INDIVIDUAL AUGMENTATION MANPOWER MANAGEMENT (IAMM), AND RESERVE COMPONENT (RC) MOBILIZATION ASSIGNMENTS.
- With one standard, we ensure each Sailor gets the training and resources necessary for success.

Cost-effective = better warfighting capability

- We are a provider of choice for because we deliver timely, cost-effective operational capabilities, through our people and equipment, which are relevant and valued by the Navy.
- Being cost-effective is one way we live our Navy Reserve Motto: **Ready Now. Anytime, Anywhere.**

SEASONAL FLU AND H1N1

Immunization is the primary method of reducing seasonal flu illness.

- It is DoD's policy that annual seasonal influenza vaccinations are required for all active duty, Selected Reserves and healthcare workers.
- All military personnel will be vaccinated against the H1N1 virus.
- The H1N1 vaccine will be available to family members who want it.
- Get immunized for the seasonal flu.
- There are different vaccines for the seasonal flu and H1N1. Vaccination against H1N1 requires a different vaccine than seasonal flu.
- Seasonal flu vaccinations will begin in September.
- H1N1 vaccinations will begin when the vaccine is available, likely early October.

Personal preventative measures can limit the effects of the seasonal and H1N1 flu.

- Cover your mouth when you cough. Covering your mouth with a tissue is best in order to limit the spread of germs.
- Wash your hands often.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- If possible, stay home from work, school and errands when you are sick.

The health and well-being of all the Navy's Total Force and beneficiaries is one of our highest priorities.
