Verification Of Page 2 In NSIPS. Reserve Personnel are no longer required to provide a paper copy of their Page 2/dependency data when reporting for AT/ADT. A lot of hard work and long hours went in to making this happen however, PSD's are voicing concerns with Reserve Personnel not verifying their Page 2 information via their NSIPS Self-Service electronic service record (NSIPS ESR) account. Verification of your Page 2 is required within 180 days of reporting for AT/ADT. This process only takes a minute or two to verify and update. Failure to update your Page 2 will cause unnecessary delays in payment of your BAH while on Active Duty. It is critical that all personnel have an ESR account to verify their dependency data. CNRFC has posted the procedures on their private side of the Navy Reserve Homeport under Reservist Toolbox

Recognition of Civilian Employers of Navy Reservists. Thursday, VADM Debbink had the privilege of recognizing 10 key employers of Navy Reservists for their dedication and support of our Navy Reservists. The group included senior personnel from IBM, Delta A/L, SAIC, USAA, BAH, Lowe's, GE Aviation, Northern/Southern Railroad, and several small employers. Joined by Secretary Dennis McCarthy (ASD R/A) and RDML Haley, they provided an overview of the operations that their Navy is conducting around the globe and how *critical their role is in enabling the service of our Reserve Component Sailors*. Their commitment to Reservists and their families allows the Sailors to serve on a part-time basis and to *stay "Ready Now" for full-time service when called*.

Visit to CNRFC and NRMA MEDHOLD. This week VADM Debbink and FORCM Wright visited with the Navy Reserve Forces Command staff in Norfolk and the NRMA MEDHOLD East Sailors. The trip enabled meaningful interactions with our staff in Norfolk. As part of VADM Debbink's regular schedule of visits to the MEDHOLD units, he was able to discuss the current process improvement review of the Navy MEDHOLD program and the importance of their candid feedback and communication during the surveys. VADM Debbink was pleased to see the level of engagement by the NRMA RCC and MEDHOLD East leadership, keeping *patient care and process improvement as the top priorities*.

Navy Reservists Provide Valued Capabilities During SEA BREEZE 2010 (SB10). Nine RC Sailors from NR CNE-C6F DET 802, NOSC Atlanta, are *servicing on Active Duty in the Ukraine, supporting the execution phase of SB10*. The Reservists are performing watch standing duties and planning counter-piracy drills during the Combined Maritime Exercise.

Rep. Paul Broun (GA) Commissioned in the Navy Reserve Medical Community. Rep. Paul Broun (GA-10th District) was commissioned as a Selected Reserve Medical Officer by the Commandant of the Marine Corps today. A former USMC jet mechanic, Rep. Broun now brings *his expertise and capabilities as a medical doctor to the service of our Navy and our Nation*.

Reservists Deliver Full Time Excellence to JIATF-South Counter Drug Operations. Supporting the counter drug UAS operations in the SOUTHCOM AOR, six Navy Reservists are serving as UAS mission commanders, intelligence briefers and analysts conducting aerial surveillance and suspect-vessel intercepts. JIATF-S is effectively *leveraging the Reservists' civilian experience in the law enforcement, aviation and Customs/Border Patrol career fields*. To date, the deployment has resulted in the recorded surveillance of several trafficking rendezvous points, two major drug busts, and the seizure of 1,191 kilograms of illegal narcotics.
