MISSION: Youth Outreach

Boys & Girls Clubs of America has joined forces with the Navy and Marine Corps to offer children of sailors and marines free programs and services at local Clubs. MISSION: Youth Outreach is a new initiative. Through this program, BCGA proudly shows its support for military families by expanding the reach of our after-school and summer programs to the children of military personnel, whether active duty or Reserve. Our goal: to give youth from Navy and Marine Corps families a positive place to go after school and on weekends – anytime kids need a place offering supervised programs designed to enrich lives. How to Use the Program
Parents can enroll their children in the program by calling 1-800-854-CLUB or going online to www.bgca.org (using the “Find A Club” feature), to find a Club in their area. Once you find the nearest Club, you'll need to go there in person to register your child. (Be sure to call the Club first to confirm their membership process.)



Drug Education For Youth (DEFY) is a self-esteem building program that provides kids with the tools they need to resist drugs, gangs, and alcohol.

Initially developed by the Drug Demand Reduction Task Force (DDRTF), DEFY is sponsored by the local command and restricted to youth ages 9-12 from military families. A 2-phase program, DEFY begins in the summer with either a five-day residential or an eight-day non-residential camp program.
